Evelyne Tegomoh is an Associate Professor of Anthropology. She is a member of the Cameroon RECLAIM team and serves as the inclusion manager. She is responsible for coordinating cross-cultural research on mobility and design localized adaptation strategies for D4.1 Dissemination & Communication Strategy. Prof Tegomoh is currently the pioneer Director of studies at the Higher Teachers Training College (HTTC) Buea, of the University of Buea, Cameroon. She is now an Associate Professor of Anthropology. She previously served as Head of Department for Tourism and Hospitality Management at the Higher Technical Teachers' Training College (HTTTC) Kumba, University of Buea and later, Dean of Studies July 2021 in the same college. Prof Tegomoh worked with the Norwegian Peace Corps, Fredskorpset, attached to the Tromsøe University Museum during which she shot and produced the film, 'Let's Share the Beauty'

(2002-2003). She thereafter completed a series of six short films, Coastal Communities with Uncertain Future, working with marginal coastal communities in Northern Norway (2005-2008) and her recent film (2020), 'The Papiakum People' of the Ndop plain. She has been lecturing socio cultural anthropology at the departments of Sociology and Anthropology and History, University of Buea, Cameroon, since 2004. Prof Tegomoh has a passion for tourism, cultural and natural resource management, mobility/migration, social change, material culture, social identity/politics of belonging, ethnicity, gender, oral tradition and event management in Cameroon.
